The phone assessments helped open doors for new business opportunities for our local manufacturers where they could create different products by transitioning their capabilities.

BIZ WALK NEW BRE INITIATIVE FOR PASCO BUSINESS OUTREACH

This program was created to bring together representatives from local agencies to provide a brief overview of how they can assist companies. We chose walkable business areas in the county and all partners met up and went into the businesses together. This initiative was created by the Pasco EDC's Business Retention & Expansion department in partnership with our workforceCONNECT program.

BizWalk representatives included partners from CareerSource, Pasco County Sheriff's Office, a local staffing agency, Pasco-Hernando State College, and Pasco County Emergency Management. During the overviews all partners presented the business community available resources for their workforce needs, safety, and tools to grow. At the same time, we were able to assess the common needs of the business community and current trends.

WORK FORCE DATA

This information was collected and analyzed by WorkforceCONNECT, a Pasco EDC Program

The WorkforceCONNECT annual report aggregates economic data from September 2019 to August 2020. This year's report was shaping up to show historically low unemployment, steady wage increases and describe a workforce that is more educated, younger and more skilled than any time in recent history. Then the sudden onset of COVID-19 changed everything. Local unemployment shot up to 13.8%, higher than what was seen during the great recession, all schools went remote after a multiweek break. Restaurants and retail were forced to shut down for weeks. This shock will have long term effects on our local labor market, some effects will be permanent and uncertainty is the prevailing sentiment among businesses as they try to reopen, restructure and begin to hire again.
