Welcome to the 2025 Annual Report,

Over the past year, the Pasco EDC team—alongside our dedicated partners—has successfully assisted 21 project expansions choosing to invest in Pasco County. This achievement represents over \$116.3 million in capital investment and 547 new jobs in our community.

At the same time, Pasco County continues to foster a strong environment for entrepreneurship, with an encouraging increase in business startups. Our local "economic soil" remains fertile for innovation and growth.

Our SMARTstart program continues to support entrepreneurs of all types, including those focused on social impact. This year, we proudly hosted our second "CO. STARTERS for Causes" cohort, graduating 10 individuals committed to strengthening the community's human services safety net.



We're seeing a rise in projects where industries adopt more efficient technologies, including AI and automation which is increasing our active project count and helping to diversify our economy and reduce risk. And it's not just new businesses that are thriving here. Last year, we supported 15 of our existing companies in expanding their operations right here in Pasco County. This speaks volumes about the value we place on long-term relationships and our commitment to helping local businesses grow.

One of the year's standout moments came during the groundbreaking of Bauducco Foods. We were thrilled to stand beside them as they announced their plan to expand their footprint to 900,000 square feet—more than double the original project size.

As President and CEO, I am proud to lead a passionate and high-performing team, supported by a dedicated board of directors that shares our mission and vision. This year, our team earned several accolades from both the Florida Economic Development Council (FEDC) and the International Economic Development Council (IEDC), our industry's official accrediting body.

A major highlight was Pasco EDC receiving the prestigious Accredited Economic Development Organization (AEDO) designation, placing us among fewer than 100 such organizations worldwide. This recognition affirms our professional excellence, strategic approach, and commitment to best practices. AEDO status signals to our community and to the world that Pasco EDC is a leader in the field of economic development.

We are deeply grateful for the continued support of Pasco County Government, our local Chambers of Commerce, academic institutions, workforce and training partners, and our investors. 

There are currently 157 LEADS and 113 ACTIVE PROJECTS in the pipeline with 21 SUCCESSES this fiscal year, with 6 of 21 successes being recruitment.

Through the Business Retention & Expansion (BR&E) program we partner year-round with Pasco companies to listen, learn, and help them grow. This year, our team met with 80 primary employers to spot trends, address needs, and connect them to support. Those efforts helped existing businesses expand across Pasco County, driving more than \$75 million in capital investment and over 450 new jobs.

PASCO BIZ CONNECT CAMPAIGN

Our ongoing campaign shines a light on the available BR&E program resources through weekly social posts, monthly emails, and a resource library. The initiative earned recognition by the International Economic Development Council with an Excellence in Economic Development Bronze Award in the Email Newsletter category after doubling engagement in its second year and sustaining a 16 percent email click-through rate.





WorkforceCONNECT makes it easier for employers and career seekers to connect through a user-friendly hub designed for the Pasco business community. Available tools include:

- ConnectOPP: Employers can share internships, apprenticeships, and facility tours that spark career discovery, reveal career pathways, and guide people toward the skills they need to succeed.
- Resource Libraries: A collection of available tools and sources, curated for both employers and job-seekers.
- Find Your Place Tool: An interactive map to find employers in Pasco County that offer employee training and/or professional development opportunities.

PASCO 50

Pasco 50 is a WorkforceCONNECT semiannual event for human resource professionals throughout Pasco County to discuss workforce trends in the community. Themes featured this year included:

WOMEN IN SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING, THE ARTS, AND MATHEMATICS (STEAM)







These weekly campaigns share business spotlights and resources available for existing businesses. This year the campaign reached over 75,000 people with over 6,000 engagements.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT WEEK #ECONDEVWEEK25

Every year we celebrate #EconDevWeek with IEDC. This year during the 5-day campaign, we reached over 10,000 people with over 800 engagements, averaging a total of 150 engagements per day.



PASCO EDC PARTNERS IN SUCCESS

Pasco EDC relies on the generous support of private sector partners as well as the generous contributions from the Pasco Board of County Commissioners and local community partners to ensure that we have the resources available to deliver the high-quality services Pasco EDC has become known for.



HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS YEAR'S FUNDRAISING EFFORTS INCLUDE:

- Private investor contributions totaled \$536,250 from 92 investors.
- Economic Forecast Luncheon sponsorships reached \$6,000 from CareerSource Pasco Hernando, Construction Services Inc. of Tampa, BayCare Wesley Chapel, and Morton Plant North Bay Hospital.
- Microloan program received donations to continue to seed from Wells Fargo at \$15,000, Bank of Tampa at \$2,500, and Fifth Third Bank at \$5,000.
- Microloan interest earned from the existing 25 loans totaling \$56,140 has been rolled back into the capitalization of the Microloan program.
- CareerSource Pasco Hernando awarded a \$10,000 grant to continue to enhance the WorkforceCONNECT website.
- Duno Family and the Greater Pasco Chamber of Commerce both donated \$345 each towards the CO.STARTERS for Causes class.
- Santander Consumer USA awarded a \$60,000 grant to provide scholarships to entrepreneurs for incubation memberships and to attend CO.STARTERS classes. An additional \$5,000 was granted to market all the SMARTstart programs.
- Duke Energy provided a \$10,000 grant to fund a Life Science Corridor branding initiative.
- Pasco County maintained its base funding of \$626,130 which includes a \$35,000 contribution towards Global Tampa Bay.
- Pasco County continues to fund all of the Penny For Pasco programs: Ready Sites, WorkforceCONNECT, SMARTstart Business Incubators, Microloan, and CO.STARTERS. The Pasco Board of County Commissioners approved cooperative funding agreements totaling \$9,393,030 which started in 2015 and continues these services through 2025.
